Dear Sir,

I returned from Paris
this morning. I saw
Mr. Jules Mohl on Friday
morning at his own house
having missed him on
Monday at the Institute.

He was then engaged to said
in writing to you.

The Academy accept with
pleasure the gift you offer
and Mr. Nohl seems to
appreciate your researches
thoroughly.

I have arranged with him
that the roll is to be put
into a waterproof box
and with the other Boxes

to be confided to Mr. Nowlin the
Bookkeeper & agent of the Insti-
tute who will forward them
in the regular way.

If the boxes are sent to the
Embassy they will not reach
the Institute for some time.
The paper you sent by that
Channel never reached the
Institute at all!

I therefore intend to have a
Box made for the Roll at once

(at the expense of the Institute)
and on Wednesday I shall
if I do not hear from you to
the contrary hand both Boxes
over to Mr. Molini.
