REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

for the year ended 31st December, 1946.

The Council has pleasure in presenting its one hundred and eighteenth Annual Report to the Annual General Meeting of the Society, to be held on Tuesday, 29th April, 1947, at 4 p.m., in the Society's Offices in Regent's Park.

The course of the proceedings, after the Chair has been taken, will be

as follows :-

Notice of any motion arising out of the discussion shall be given in writing to the Secretary after the Annual General Meeting, and the motion shall be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of Chapter XI, Section V of the Bye-laws.

- 7. Report of the Scrutineers on the result of the ballot for the Candidates for the Council and for the Publications Committee.
- 8. Opening of the ballot for the election of the Officers.
- 9. Report of the Scrutineers on the result of the ballot for the Officers.
 No other business shall be transacted at such Meeting.

Except when there is a contested election or when an Officer proposed for election is not already a member of the Council when the Meeting opens, the ballots for the Council and for the Officers may be taken together and the reports of the Scrutineers thereon received together.

ORDINARY GENERAL MEETINGS.—Until further notice, these meetings are being held in the Meeting Room at the Society's Offices on the third Wednesday of each month (except September and October), at 4.30 p.m.

Scientific Meetings.—The Society carried out the practice it has now adopted of holding eight scientific meetings during the year, on the second Tuesday in the months February to June and October to December. The meetings commence at 5 p.m., and tea is served in the Library at 4.15 p.m.

During the year these meetings were very well attended. On at least two occasions the Meeting Room at the Society's offices was scarcely large enough to accommodate all those desiring admission. The Agenda for the Scientific Meetings can be obtained on application to the Secretary.

The Society's rooms have been repeatedly placed at the disposition of various other scientific organizations, including the following: -Association of British Zoologists, South-Eastern Union of Scientific Societies, National Utility Poultry Society, Institute for the Study of Animal Behaviour, Association of Bird Watchers and Wardens, Society for the Preservation of the Fauna of the Empire, World List of Scientific Periodicals, International Biological Council, Ornamental Pheasant Society, National Medical Veterinary Association, International Committee for the Protection of Birds.

OBITUARY.—During the year under review the Society has suffered the loss by death of many of its Fellows. We record their decease with deep regret.

Among them two should be specially mentioned.

Major Stanley Smyth Flower, O.B.E., F.L.S., whose death occurred on the 3rd February, 1946, had been a Fellow since 1896, and had rendered valuable service to the Society, particularly as a Member of Council between the years 1924 and 1936. He was very keen on the preservation of wild life, but will be remembered especially for his valuable contributions to our knowledge of longevity in animals in captivity not only by his personal observations, but by collecting and publishing data on the subject. Major Flower was Director of the Zoological Gardens at Cairo from 1898 to 1924.

Edward George Boulenger, who died in May 1946, was Curator of Reptiles from 1911 to 1924, Director of the Aquarium from 1924 to 1938, and Director of the Aquarium and Curator of Reptiles from 1938 until his retirement at the outbreak of war. Boulenger's name will always be associated with the Aquarium at Regent's Park, the success of which was in great measure due to his perseverance and enthusiasm. His knowledge of the keeping and exhibition of reptiles and fish in captivity was unrivalled. He also made many journeys to the Continent in search of specimens for the Aquarium and Reptile House.

Staff.—Dr. R. E. Rewell has been appointed as Pathologist-Parasitologist, to replace Col. A. E. Hamerton who retired in September, 1946, and Mr. E. H. Tong as Superintendent of Whipsnade, to replace Capt. W. P. B. Beal who will be retiring in June 1947.

The following are new appointments: - Dr. T. A. Cockburn as Assistant Superintendent at Regent's Park; Mr. J. W. Lester as Curator of Reptiles; Mr. E. O. Longley as Veterinary Research Officer; and Mr. F. A. Stengelhofen as Architect.

In the Catering Department, Mr. W. N. Hill and Mr. E. G. Rhodes have been appointed Managers at Regent's Park and Whipsnade Park respectively, to replace Mr. A. Schorno who resigned in May, 1946.

STAFF COMPENSATION AND SICK BENEFIT FUND.-Dr. G. M. Vevers, the Superintendent of the Gardens, contributed the sum of £55 5s., repre-· senting fees for literary work.

SILVER MEDAL.—The Silver Medal of the Society was awarded to William H. Chippendale, Esq., C.M.Z.S., for assistance over many years in obtaining South American animals.

AMENDMENT OF THE CHARTER.—The draft of the new Charter has been prepared by Counsel and was submitted to the Privy Council on the 23rd September, 1946.

ROLL OF FELLOWS.—The number of Fellows at 31st December, 1946, was 6433 as compared with 6354 at the end of 1945.

Scientific Publications.—The attention of Fellows is called to the subscription rates, payable on the 1st January each year, which are as follows:—

Proceedings £1 1s. 0d. per annum. Proceedings and Transactions . . . £1 11s. 6d. ,,

It is hoped that more Fellows will take advantage of the opportunity of subscribing to their scientific publications, which are offered on such favourable terms. The published value of the publications for the year under review exceeds £8 as against the subscription rate of £1 11s. 6d.

Volume 116 of the *Proceedings* has been completed by the issue of Parts III and IV in February 1947. As in the past, papers have been submitted not only from workers in this country and the Empire, but also from other parts of the world, including the U.S.A., U.S.S.R., and China.

The publication of the *Transactions* is still held up by various difficulties. The printing of the large monograph, "A Synopsis of the Monogenetic Trematodes," by Miss Nora G. Sproston, comprising 416 pages and 118 figures, was completed in November, 1946, but the stitching and binding delayed its appearance until February, 1947. "The Development of the Monotremata," Part VI, by Professor T. Thomson Flynn and Professor

J. P. Hill, is now in the Press and will be published in 1947.

The papers that have appeared in the Proceedings deal with a great variety of subjects, and it is difficult to single out any particular article, but mention may be made of an interesting monograph on the edibility of birds, by Dr. Hugh B. Cott, which is illustrated by five years' experiments and observations on the food preferences of the hornet, cat and man, and considered with special reference to the theories of adaptive coloration; Dr. J. E. Webb discusses spiracle structure as a guide to the phylogenetic relationships of the biting and sucking lice, and gives notes on the affinities of the mammalian hosts. A new classification of insect pupae by Mr. H. E. Hinton; keys to the Ethiopian Tachinidae—Deximae by Dr. F. I. van Emden; mechanical disturbance and light as factors influencing the pullulation of Calandra granaria L. by Dr. H. C. Browning; and ecological studies of the mating habits of certain species of Corixidae and their significance, by Dr. E. J. Popham, are among the papers dealing with insects. Anatomical contributions are represented by an important memoir on the fore-brain, diencephalon and mid-brain of the American Diamond-Backed Rattlesnake by Dr. F. J. Warner. The mode of action of the heart of the frog, by Mr. G. E. H. Foxon, comprises the description of a new method of observing the action of the heart, as a result of which the generally accepted view of the distribution of the blood to various parts of the body is shown to be incorrect. Finally, reference may be made to two papers by Mr. F. R. Parrington, on the cranial anatomy of Cynodonts, and on a collection of Rhaetic mammalian teeth, and one by Dr. P. M. Butler on the evolution of carnassial dentitions in the Mammalia.

The Society has now resumed the practice of publishing the reports on the Additions to the Menagerie, the publication of which was suspended in 1937. These lists are issued together with the Agenda and Abstracts of the Scientific Meetings, and are published monthly.

ZOOLOGICAL RECORD.—Bound copies of Volume 80, dealing principally with the literature of 1943, were finally issued on 18th March, 1946. The separate parts had all been completed by the autumn of 1945, but owing to labour restrictions, the binding of the volumes was delayed for nearly six months.

It is hoped that Volume 81 will be issued during the summer of 1947; the majority of the separate parts have already been published, and the few outstanding ones are now in the Press. The preparation of Volume 82 is in hand, and three of the sections are already in the Press. It is regretted that, in spite of every effort, it has not been possible to arrange for the more speedy issue of these volumes, owing to the difficulties of printing and binding.

It should be emphasised that donations to the Zoological Record are still quite inadequate, and further support is urgently required from societies and individuals who wish this invaluable work to continue. At present the sum of at least £2,000 is required to finance each volume, and the cost is increasing because a larger number of publications have had to be dealt with since the costs tion of hostilities

NOMENCLATOR ZOOLOGICUS.—The first edition of this publication (published in four volumes during 1939 and 1940) was financed privately by Dr. Sheffield A. Neave and R. W. Lloyd, Esq., and by 1946 there was a surplus of about £1,200. During the year Dr. Neave and Mr. Lloyd offered to enter into a new agreement with the Society by which they would transfer this surplus to the Society, together with the existing stock of approximately 1,000 copies of each of the four volumes, with the object of creating a permanent Neave-Lloyd Nomenclator Zoologicus Fund to finance the cost of future supplements. The Council gratefully accepted this generous offer and wish to place on record their appreciation of this gift which will ensure that this important publication is kept up to date in perpetuity. The new agreement which was made on the 24th July 1946 also provides that any surplus on this Fund in excess of the amount required to meet the cost of future supplements may be used by the Society for the printing etc., of other scientific publications provided that they are mainly of a bibliographical character.

Zoo Life.—The first number of this new magazine appeared in April, 1946, and the four parts comprising Volume I were published during the year. The title-page, contents and index of this volume will be issued to all subscribers together with the first part of Volume II, which is now in the Press. The circulation of this magazine, at present about 10,000 copies, is restricted owing to paper control, but as soon as more paper becomes available a much larger number of subscribers is anticipated. The subscription rate is 10s. per annum to the public, but Fellows may obtain it at the reduced rate of 7s. 6d. per annum, plus 1s. extra for postage in each case. Subscription forms for Volume II have been circulated to all Fellows. At present not quite half of them have become subscribers, and it is hoped that those who have not yet done so will help to support this, their official magazine. It should be emphasised that all subscriptions should be forwarded to the publishers, Messrs. Gale & Polden, Ltd., Ideal House, Argyll Street, London, W.1, and not to the Society's offices.

LIBRARY.—A great deal of the time of the Library Staff has been taken up by restoring to their original positions the large number of books which had been stored in various places of safety during the war years. This work has now been completed.

The number of visits to the Library by Fellows and persons introduced by them was above the average, and 1,892 volumes were borrowed.

The preparation has begun of a new catalogue of periodicals in the Library. This is being compiled so that all titles of periodicals will be presented in accordance with the method used in the "World List of Scientific Periodicals."

The additions to the Library acquired by purchase, presentation or exchange were 94 books and 3,596 parts of 371 serials. The volumes of periodicals bound during the year were 886 in number.

Gifts of books to the Library will be greatly appreciated, particularly

copies of Fellows' own works.

PICTURES.—Through the generosity of Mr. A. Spencer Moore a very fine portrait in oils of Sir Stamford Raffles, attributed to Lonsdale, has been presented to the Society. This has been hung in the Council Room. The Society is also indebted to Mr. A. J. Healey and a cousin of his for a collection of six animal pictures by Joseph Wolf and one by Carl

Haag.

The oil painting by Roland Savery, depicting the Dodo and various other birds, which has been in the Society's possession for many years, has been cleaned and restored.

VISITORS.—The number of visitors during 1946 was 2,745,483 at Regent's Park and 458,041 at Whipsnade Park. The corresponding figures for 1945 were 2,208,134 and 235,442 respectively. The number of visitors at Regent's Park was the highest in the history of the Society, exceeding the previous highest figure (1928) by no less than 519,821.

AQUARIUM.—The number of visitors during 1946 was 605,003 compared with 573,545 for the year 1945. The number for 1946 exceeded the previous highest figure (1945) by 31,458.

CHILDREN'S Zoo.—The Children's Zoo was open for the summer season from 1st June until 31st October. The number of visitors during the season was 383,815 compared with 367,329 for the 1945 season. The number for 1946 exceeded the previous highest figure (1945) by 16,486.

Band.—The London Military Band played in the Gardens at Regent's Park on Sunday afternoons during the summer months, and the A.T.C. Central Band of No. 65 Group R.A.F. on two Saturday afternoons towards the end of the season.

Restaurant Facilities.—During the year under review it was found impossible to obtain a permit for the reconditioning of the Fellows' Restaurant. It was therefore necessary to reserve a portion of the Tea Pavilion for their use. It is hoped, however, that by the time this Report has been circulated the Fellows will have all their pre-war restaurant accommodation.

So far as catering for the public is concerned, the cafeteria system has been adopted in some of the restaurants with great success, and is being extended as circumstances permit.

Special Exhibits.—The exhibition of Mink, showing some of the striking new colour varieties, was on view at the Mappin Terraces Pavilion during some of the summer months. These animals were received on loan from Mr. Jack K. L. Aylwin, North Kildonan, Manitoba, and included examples of the mutant "glacier" in addition to those shown the previous year.

FARMING AT WHIPSNADE.—The Society has continued to carry on farming operations on the undeveloped portions of Whipsnade Park. A herd of pedigree Aberdeen Angus cattle, comprising eight heifers and one bull, has been obtained and is doing well.

LEGACIES.—The following legacies were received during the year:—£100 from the late William James Clark; a further sum of £55 from the late Major Arthur Corrie Keep; the balance of £275 10s. 5d. in respect of

the one-third share of the residuary estate of the late Rev. Charles Louis Dessoulavy.

PROSECTORIUM.—This department continued its investigations in animal pathology and parasitology, and supplied institutions with

zoological material which is now difficult to obtain elsewhere.

The number of deaths at Regent's Park investigated by post-mortem examination during 1946 was 813 (271 mammalian, 348 avian and 194 reptilian). At Whipsnade Park the number was 130 (69 mammalian and 61 avian).

Labels.—The preparation of enamel title-plates for the exhibits at Regent's Park and at Whipsnade has progressed throughout the year. In addition, a number of coloured enamel paintings of birds have been completed to aid in the identification of birds in aviaries containing more than one species. Owing to the difficulty of the medium and the changes that sometimes occur during firing, these paintings cannot give a detailed representation of the originals, and are merely intended to help the visitor to distinguish between the various occupants. As stated in previous reports, the cost of these labels is being met by the grant made to the Society by the Pilgrim Trust.

Collections.—In addition to many acquisitions by gift and purchase during 1946, the Society organised five expeditions for the purpose of bringing home large collections of animals to re-stock the Regent's Park Gardens.

Most notable amongst these was the very large collection of East African mammals, birds and reptiles brought home in October by the Society's Curator-Collector, Mr. C. S. Webb. Earlier in the year Keeper Hubert Jones brought back the first consignment of Cape Penguins since the war, and Mr. A. G. Bennett, C.M.Z.S., visited the Falkland Islands and South America with the object of collecting Penguins and to accompany the large collection of South American animals which Mr. W. H. Chippendale, C.M.Z.S., had got together on behalf of the Society.

Mr. Wilfrid Frost visited India and Ceylon and was instrumental in obtaining three young Indian Elephants, two of which were presented to the Society by Mr. Alfred Ezra, O.B.E., F.Z.S. Mr. Frost also brought back with him the private collection of animals which Dr. W. C. Osman Hill, F.Z.S., had left in Colombo on his retirement from the Chair of Anatomy at the Colombo University and which he presented to the

Society.

Later in the year, Mr. Edward Tanner, Head Keeper of the Small Bird House, brought home a large collection, consisting mainly of birds, from the Gold Coast. Among the most striking of these was a collection of Touracous presented to the Society by Sir Alan Burns, K.C.M.G., C.M.Z.S., Governor of the Gold Coast. While he was in West Africa, Mr. Tanner enjoyed the hospitality of Mr. G. S. Cansdale, C.M.Z.S., at the Forestry Station at Oda, and received valuable assistance and many gifts of animals from him.

FINANCE.

INCOME AND EXPENDITURE.

(a) REGENT'S PARK. The income was £282,609 (an increase of £59,493) and the expenditure amounted to £204,250 (an increase of £98,324).

(b) Whipsnade Park. The income was £50,044 (an increase of £25,054), and the expenditure amounted to £47,525 (an increase

of £21,346).

(c) Surplus. The net surplus after making appropriations to various Funds to meet future liabilities amounted to £15,753, as compared with a surplus of £33,857 for 1945.

ASSETS, LIABILITIES AND BALANCE.

(a) Assets. At the end of the year the total assets of the Society amounted to £682,099, an increase of £129,549 on the corresponding figure for 1945.

(b) LIABILITIES. The liabilities amounted to £84,528, an increase of

£45,659 on the corresponding figure for 1945.

(c) BALANCE. The balance, a surplus of assets over liabilities, amounted to £597,571, an increase of £83,890 on the corresponding figure for 1945.

It will be observed that, though the income of the Society was the highest on record, there has been a corresponding increase in the cost of maintaining its Collections at Regent's Park and Whipsnade, and it is anticipated that in the coming year this will be at least £260,000. Consequently, unless the public support in future years approximates to that of 1946, it is unlikely that it will be possible to make material additions to the General Reserve and Post-War Development Fund. Though this Fund now stands at £238,284, this figure will be insufficient to meet the anticipated cost of new buildings and other improvements and therefore donations to it will be welcomed.
