Sir.

I have the honor to acknowledge your letter of the 23 ult relative to my zoological collections.

2 With reference to the extent of these collections, recently & formerly delivered, it may conduce to future convenience if the keeper of the Zoology be directed to submit to the Trustees a summary statement showing the totals of what has been received by the Museum, what retained by it, & what distributed elsewhere, in the shape of skins, bones, or drawings.

3 The following are the parties to whom I wish the duplicate skins to be transmitted, in the order in which they are set down. India House Leyden. Paris. Berlin. Frankfurt adiubris. Dublin. Newcastle. Cagliari. Manchester. ^{from the Earl of Derby.} Hastings.

4 The duplicate bones I wish to be delivered to the Royal Coll^g. ^{the} Geom London, to the Zoological Society London, & to the

of what is available, & the receipt
of the Catalogue he is engaged to far-
-nise, in order to deliver these
letters.

6 With regard to the missing
-seated to the British Museum, I
have the honor to state that I
have recovered & delivered to

Society: Sir Alex. Johnston: Pro-
fessor H. H. Wilson.

7 M'Howard, I find, is at length
forthcoming & admits having a
complete set of the Mammal Draw-
-ings which however he attempts
to retain possession of under pretence
the facility of which Mr. New King
of your Museum can establish.
No time should be lost in recov-
-ering these drawings from his
Howard.
