

Larkham Oct 10th 1843

Dear B.

We arrived here
last night having made
but two marches from Cherrington

Campbell is out of his wits
& love with the difference &
beauty of this country at your
Smyth's description.

We are getting on extremely well

The Federal Game man is
splendid but the Smyth
I doubt my old uncle who
often turned his services back

& who was ordered by the
Navy to clear the road has

been as sulky & obstinate as a
pig & done nothing at all.

Campbell behaves splendidly

I has lost ten times more

campfire water than three
days than Felix at the time

I was with you ever since. It
does immense good. If I had
believed a little more I should
have got on better - but it is
very interesting to find Campbell
sending the advice he presented
me with to the wind &
outthrusting me as I take him
in every point. He has
Japan you adopted a most
admirable course in relation
to the Rajah & to the
people. & we will do extremely
well.

The gentleman Livingston South
has put his foot in it & is
utterly stupid - I never got
one angry with him. He
always acted to the letter of the
spirit of (C's advice) to address
to trust him. You & your
agent I warned him of the

danger he was running in treating
me as he did. & now he finds it
true - Shows of all his power
& proved to contradict all his
former lies he now comes back
to state a most humiliating
position in the scenes of his
former glory.

The snow line is down 2000 ft
since August...! So my bank
of its Siberian elevation is
settled.

We are making already
trying at sunrise which does
not leave me the time I
need to have to write you
it is unaccountably cold now at
sunrise.
