REPORT OF THE COUNCIL.

April 29, 1887.

THE Council have the pleasure of submitting to the Fellows their fifty-eighth Annual Report upon the progress

of the Society.

This, in accordance with previous Reports, is divided into three heads, the first of which relates to the General Condition of the Society and its Finances, the second to the business transacted at the Office in Hanover Square, and the last to the state of the Gardens in the Regent's Park.

I. GENERAL CONDITION OF THE SOCIETY.

2. STATE OF THE FINANCES.

a. Income.

Although the Garden-receipts of 1886 were larger by the sum of £82 17s. 6d. than those of the previous year, and a greater amount was also realized by Garden Sales, slight fallings-off in other branches of Income took place, which more than counterbalanced these additions, and left the Society's total receipts for 1886 less by the sum of £22 9s. 9d. than those of 1885.

Thus the total Income of the Society for the past year was £25,787 0s. 4d. against £25,809 10s. 1d., the corresponding amount for the previous year, as is shown in the subjoined Table:—

b. Expenditure.

On the other hand, a considerable saving was effected in the Expenditure of 1886 without, as the Council believe, in any way prejudicially affecting the Society's establishments here or at the Gardens. These economies, as will be seen by the subjoined table, resulted in a diminution of expenditure of £154 13s. 11d. in Ordinary, and £361 5s. 6d. in Extraordinary Expenditure, which in 1886 consisted of the following two items only: £100 granted in aid of the establishment of the new Laboratory of the Marine Biological Association at Plymouth, which the Council believe will be of great importance to the future advance of marine zoology, and £29 15s. expended on the foundations of the New Dog-kennels, which are spoken of in a subsequent part of the Report.

Thus the total Expenditure of the Society in 1886 was £24,568 12s. 9d., instead of £25,084 12s. 2d. as in 1885. Besides this the sum of £1000 was devoted to the reduction by that amount of the Mortgage-debt on this House and Premises. After these payments were effected, a sum of £1190 15s. 8d. (as shown by the subjoined Abstract of the Balance-sheet) remained to be carried over for the benefit of the present year.

Thus, it will be observed, the Income of 1886 was more than sufficient to meet the whole Expenditure of the year, and to devote a sum of £1000 to what is virtually a

Reserve-fund. This, it is submitted, is not an unsatisfactory financial state of affairs, although it does not rival the success of some former years, before the present period of "depression" set in.

II. OFFICE, 3 HANOVER SQUARE.

1. Scientific Meetings.

To the fourteen meetings for the despatch of scientific business held in the Society's Rooms in Hanover Square in 1886, 117 communications were made. Of these, 88 were from Fellows, 1 from a Foreign Member, and 12 from Corresponding Members of the Society. The remaining 16 papers were from individuals not belonging to the Society, and were communicated to it by the Secretary or by other Members. The corresponding number of communications in the year 1885 was 122.

These communications were submitted to the Committee of Publication, by whom the following orders were made respecting them: 1 was ordered to be printed entire in the 'Transactions' of the Society, and 79 in the 'Proceedings,' such illustrations being in each case allowed as the Committee considered necessary for the purpose. Of the remaining communications, abstracts or extracts were considered to be sufficient for publication.

2. Scientific Publications.

The volume of 'Proceedings' for 1886 is on the table. It contains 716 pages illustrated by 60 plates. In the following table are given the number of pages and plates of the volumes of 'Proceedings' for the past ten years:—

At the date of the Anniversary last year the publication of the Society's 'Transactions' had fallen somewhat into arrear, owing to difficulties connected with the final revise of one of the memoirs in the eleventh volume.

The only remaining memoir ordered by the Committee of Publication to be printed in the 'Transactions' up December 31, 1886, has been published this year.

3. ZOOLOGICAL RECORD.

The Council take this opportunity of informing the Fellows that they have undertaken on behalf of the Society to publish the 'Zoological Record,' commencing

with the volume for the past year (1886).

The 'Zoological Record,' which consists of an Annual Volume containing a summary of the work done by British and Foreign Naturalists in the various branches of Zoology in each year, is most useful-indeed it may be almost said indispensable—to working Zoologists. For the past 16 years it has been carried on by the "Zoological Record Association" with the assistance of grants from the Government Fund of the Royal Society, from the British Association, and for some years (1871-1881) from this Society. The Zoological Record Association having been unsuccessful in obtaining the continuance of some of these grants, and being unwilling to carry on the publication of the Zoological Record any longer, have agreed to transfer the whole of their stock of the issued volumes of the Record to this Society upon terms which the Council believe will not ultimately cause this Society any loss, and upon the understanding that the Society will undertake the future publication of the Record. This condition the Council, looking to the advancement of Zoology, which their Charter specifies as the leading object of the Society, thought they would be fully justified in undertaking. Beginning with the year 1886, therefore, the 'Zoological Record' will be prepared and published by this Society under the superintendence of a Committee of the Council specially selected for that purpose, and will be edited by Mr. F. E. Beddard, M.A., the Society's Prosector and Davis-lecturer.

The terms on which the annual volume of the 'Zoo-logical Record' may be obtained by Fellows of the Society and others, as also those on which sets of the

previous volumes may be purchased, have already been communicated to every Fellow of the Society in a circular sent out along with the balloting papers.

4. LIBRARY.

The Library, under the superintendence of Mr. Water-house, has been kept in good order during the past year, and has been in constant use by working zoologists.

The new edition of the Library Catalogue, the preparation of which was mentioned in the last Report, is now ready for issue. It contains the titles of about 6560 publications.

III. GARDENS, REGENT'S PARK.

1. WORKS AND REPAIRS.

In view of the present state of financial affairs, the Council did not deem it advisable to commence any new works in the Society's Gardens during the past year. But the staff of workmen was kept busily employed throughout the summer and autumn on various repairs and renewals.

The Antelope-house was thoroughly repaired and painted both inside and out. A new Ladies' Waiting-room was built. The Band-stand was cleaned and painted. The roof of the Giraffe-house was repaired, and a large useless air-shaft, erected many years ago, removed. The Steam Cook-house in the lower yard was re-roofed and slated. In the Marsupial-house, the hot-water apparatus, which was of antiquated construction, was removed, and new pipes laid in its place. These and various other minor repairs and alterations kept the Society's staff of workmen in full employment throughout the season of 1886.

It should also be mentioned that in the autumn of 1886 the foundations were laid for the New Dog-Kennels, intended to accommodate the series of wild animals of the genus Canis. These will be placed on the extreme southern face of the Gardens, beyond the Lion-house, on a site that, as mentioned in the Council's last Report, was selected some time ago for this purpose. It is hoped that this building, for which the plans have been prepared by Mr. Trollope, will be finished during the present year.

2. STAFF.

The permanent Staff of the Society's Gardens remains nearly the same as at the last Anniversary. It consists of:—

Besides these there are usually 19 Helpers in the Menagerie, 12 Garden-labourers, 9 Artisans, 3 Painters, 13 Labourers, 1 Butcher, 2 Firemen, 2 Night-Watchmen, and 1 Time-keeper employed at weekly wages; so that the number of the whole staff may be reckoned at about one hundred persons.

3. VISITORS.

The total number of visitors to the Society's Gardens during the year 1886 was 639,674, as will be seen by the following Table, which gives the corresponding numbers of entrances under each head for 1885 and 1886:—

4. PROSECTOR'S DEPARTMENT.

The Prosector (Mr. F. E. Beddard) reports as follows:— The number of deaths in the Society's Menagerie during the year has been 1077, showing an increase of 87 as com-

pared with the year 1885.

The most noteworthy are those of the Bald Ouakari (Brachyurus calvus), upon the structure of which a few notes have been communicated to the Society by the Prosector; and of a male Hippopotamus, born at the Zoological Gardens of Amsterdam in July 1876, and which had lived for nearly nine years in the Society's Gardens. In the temporary absence of the Prosector, this animal was dissected by Mr. Treves, F.R.C.S.

A large number of Hornbills, viz. three Concave-casqued Hornbills, two Rhinoceros Hornbills, and one Black

Hornbill, died within a few days of each other.

A West-African Python, which died on November 17th last, was remarkable for having lived twenty-three years in

captivity.

The remaining deaths which need a special reference were the following:—Ourang Outang; Chimpanzee; female Giraffe (purchased in 1874), which died in young; a Brazilian Tapir, born in the Gardens in 1882; and a One-

wattled Cassowary.

The following papers have been communicated by the Prosector to the 'Proceedings' of the Society as results from the study of materials derived from the Society's collection:—"Note on the Air-sacs of the Cassowary;" "On the Syrinx and other points in the Anatomy of the Caprimulgidæ;" "On some points in the Anatomy of Chauna chavaria;" "Note on the Convoluted Trachea of a Curassow, and on the Syrinx in certain Storks;" "Observations on the Ovarian Ovum of Protopterus;" "Notes on the Anatomy of Brachyurus calvus."

During the summer a course of ten lectures was delivered in the Lecture-room at the Gardens in connection with the London Society for the Extension of University Teaching. The lectures were fairly attended, fifty students altogether having entered the class. Every lecture was given twice, namely on Friday and Saturday, and after the lecture the students were conducted through the Gardens, when the principal animals referred to in the lecture were

pointed out.

Materials have been supplied for purposes of research to Prof. Haycraft, Prof. Wiedersheim, Dr. Beevor, Sir William Turner; and for museum purposes, to Prof.

Flower, Prof. D'Arcy Thompson, Prof. M'Intosh, Mr. J.

W. Clark, and Mr. C. E. Manigault.

Mr. J. B. Sutton, F.Z.S., has made use of the greater part of the pathological material for his studies on the Pathology of Animals, on which subject he has made several communications to the Society's scientific meetings.

5. ZOOLOGICAL LECTURES.

A slight alteration in the arrangements for the Davis Lectures on zoological subjects has been made for the

present year.

Mr. F. E. Beddard, M.A., Prosector to the Society, has been appointed Davis Lecturer, and has commenced a course of ten lectures on the Classification of Vertebrate Animals.

These lectures are a continuation of a series given last year in connection with the London Society for the Extension of University Teaching. In accordance with the method adopted by that Society, each lecture is followed by a class, which is occupied by an inspection and study of the animals referred to in the lecture.

The course is free to Fellows of the Society, but other attendants are required to pay a fee of 10s., which includes the admission to the Gardens on the day of lecture.

6. MENAGERIE.

a. Additions to the Menagerie in 1886.

The number of animals belonging to the first three classes of Vertebrates living in the Society's Menagerie at the close of 1886 was 2609. The corresponding number on the 31st of December, 1885, was 2551, as will be seen by the subjoined Table:—

2. Eight Tree-Snakes, born alive in the Society's Reptile-house, on the 9th of January. The mother, a fine example of Dryophis prasina, presented by Dr. F. H. Bauer, C.M.Z.S., of Buitenzorg, Java, was received on the 15th of August last.

3. Five examples of a large Batrachian of the Argentine Republic, there called "Escuerzo" (Ceratophrys ornata), presented by Dr. Frederick C. Strutt, and received February 13th.

4. A Mantled Buzzard (Leucopternis palliata) from Brazil, purchased February 15th, being the first example of this fine bird of prey received by the Society.

5. A second specimen of the Rough-billed Pelican of North America (Pelecanus trachyrhynchus), purchased March 2nd.

6. An example of the White-tailed Ichneumon (Herpestes albicauda) from Lamoo, Eastern Africa, presented by F. J. Jackson, Esq., F.Z.S., March 4th.

7. An example of an Iguanoid Lizard belonging to a new species of the genus *Ctenosaura*, which Mr. Boulenger has recently described as *C. erythromelas*, obtained by purchase April 3rd.

8. A fine male example of the Lesser Koodoo (Strepsiceros

imberbis), received in exchange on April 7th.

9. An Orange-thighed Falcon (Falco fusco-cærulescens), presented by Mr. R. J. Jones, May 5th, stated to have been obtained in Chili. This is the first example of this elegant species which has been obtained by the Society.

10. Five Senegal Parrots (Paeocephalus senegalus), presented by R. B. Sheridan, Esq., May 8th. Four of these had been bred

in this country.

11. A Glaucous Macaw (Ara glauca), purchased of the Zoological Gardens, Antwerp, June 3rd. Of this near ally of Lear's Macaw (Ara leari) we have not previously possessed a living specimen.

12. A Bald Ouakari Monkey (Brachyurus calvus), male, pur-

chased June 12th. New to the Society's collection.

13. Two young Tcheli Monkeys (Macacus tcheliensis), presented by Dr. S. W. Bushell, C.M.Z.S., of Pekin, June 17th. These Monkeys are from the mountains near the "Jung-ling," or Eastern Mausoleum of the reigning dynasty of China, which is situated some 70 miles east of Pekin.

14. A young male of the true Zebra (Equus zebra), purchased December 11th, which fills a serious void in our collection of Equidæ, no specimen of this, now rare, animal having been

received by the Society since 1867.

15. A young male Indian Rhinoceros, presented by H.H. the Maharajah of Kuch-Behar, F.Z.S., through the kind intervention of Dr. B. Simpson, C.M.Z.S., and received December 25th. This is an important acquisition, as the only other specimen we possess of this huge animal is the male presented by the late Arthur Grote, Esq., F.Z.S., which has lately shown serious symptoms of old age.

The Council have also to ask you to thank those Fellows of the Society who during the past year have audited the Accounts and have served on the Finance Committee.


