REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

for the year ended 31st December, 1948.

The Council has pleasure in presenting its one hundred and twentieth Annual Report to the Annual General Meeting of the Society, to be held on Friday, 29th April, 1949, at 4 p.m., in the Society's Offices in Regent's Park.

The course of proceedings at the Annual General Meeting, after the Chair has been taken, shall be as follows:—

- 1. Reading of the minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting.
- 2. Presentation of the Auditors' Report, previously issued to Fellows.
- 3. Discussion of the Auditors' Report.
- 4. Presentation of the Council's Annual Report, previously issued to Fellows.
- 5. Discussion of the Council's Annual Report.

Notice of any motion arising out of the discussion shall be given in writing to the Secretary after the Annual General Meeting and the motion shall be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 8, Section 4 of the Bye-Laws.

6. Announcement of the names of the Fellows elected as Officers

and ordinary members of Council.

The President or other Fellow in the Chair may at his discretion close the discussion of the Auditors' Report or the discussion of the Council's Annual Report.

No other business shall be transacted at such Meeting.

Ordinary General Meetings.—Until further notice, these meetings are being held in the Meeting Room at the Society's Offices on the third Wednesday in January, April, July, and October, at 4.30 p.m.

Scientific Meetings.—These meetings are held in the Meeting Room at the Society's Offices on the second Tuesday in the months February to June and October to December. The meetings commence at 5 p.m., and tea is served in the Library at 4.15 p.m. The Agenda for the Scientific Meetings can be obtained on application to the Secretary.

OBITUARY.—We have to record with deep regret the loss by death of

many of our Fellows during the year under review.

Among these special mention should be made of one whose services to the Society have been outstanding. Sir Bernard Bourdillon, G.C.M.G., K.B.E., Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Nigeria from 1935 to 1943,

died on 6th February, 1948.

On his retirement, after a distinguished career in the Government service, he was elected to the Council and served from 1944 to 1945 and from 1946 onwards. His keen interest in ornithology, together with his wide general experience, made him a most valuable member of Council and he was appointed Chairman of the Garden and Whipsnade Committee. His untimely death deprives the Society of one who did his utmost to promote its best interests.

Changes in Council.—In February, 1948, the Council, in accordance with the provisions of the Charter, elected to its body Norman B. Kinnear, Esq., C.B., in place of Sir Bernard H. Bourdillon, G.C.M.G., K.B.E. (died 6th February, 1948).

STAFF.—Dr. G. M. Vevers, who had been Superintendent of the Gardens at Regent's Park since March, 1923, retired owing to ill-health in December, 1948. The Council wishes to place on record its very high appreciation of the long and devoted service that Dr. Vevers gave to the Society.

Mr. G. S. Cansdale, previously Assistant Superintendent, was appointed Superintendent from the 16th December, 1948. The title of Mr. C. S. Webb, Curator-Collector, was changed to Curator of Mammals and Birds.

STAFF COMPENSATION AND SICK BENEFIT FUND.—Dr. G. M. Vevers, the Superintendent of the Gardens, contributed the sum of £77 12s. 6d. representing fees for private work.

CHARTER AND BYE-LAWS.—The Supplemental Charter was issued by the Privy Council on 18th May, 1948, and the new Bye-laws adopted at the Ordinary General Meeting held on 17th November, 1948.

WAR-TIME EMERGENCY POWERS.—The Directions made by the Lord President of the Council in 1940 and 1943 modifying certain provisions of the Charter and Bye-Laws in pursuance of the Chartered and Other Bodies (Temporary Provisions) Act, 1939, were revoked on 1st December, 1948.

Roll of Fellows.—The number of Fellows at 31st December, 1948, was 6,910 as compared with 6,668 at the end of 1947.

Scientific Publications.—The attention of Fellows is again called to the subscription rates, payable on the 1st January each year. These are as follows :-

£1 1s. 0d. per annum. Proceedings Proceedings and Transactions . . . £1 11s. 6d.

The published price of the complete volume of the Proceedings is 80s, and the advance subscription price is 70s. Fellows are therefore privileged to obtain this publication at less than one-third of the charge to the

general public.

During the year two parts of the Transactions have been issued at a published price of £1 1s. 0d. and £1 5s. 0d. respectively, as compared with the additional cost of only 10s. 6d. to Fellows subscribing to the Proceedings. It is hoped, therefore, that more Fellows will take advantage of the opportunity of obtaining their scientific publications, which are offered on such favourable terms.

Volume 118 of the Proceedings, comprising 1,183 pages, has been completed by the issue of Part 4 in February, 1949. This volume is nearly one-third larger than the preceding volume, and the Proceedings are now about the same size as in the years shortly before the war. It still remains the only British journal devoted to zoology in its widest aspects, and as usual, contains contributions from many parts of the world.

The volume comprises 57 papers on many subjects, ranging from taxonomy and comparative anatomy to experimental embryology. As in the past, some of the contributions are based largely on material from

the Society's Prosectorium.

It is difficult to select any particular papers, but mention may be made of the "Monograph of the Genera and Species of Macronyssidæ" by Dr. Flavio de Fonseca of the Instituto Butantan, Brazil; "The Arachnida of British Guiana" by Lodovico di Caporiacco, University of Florence; "Dicynodon and its Allies," by Professor D. M. S. Watson; and a "Key to the Rodents of S.W. Asia in the British Museum Collection" by J. R. Ellerman.

The Transactions are represented by Parts 2 and 3 of Volume XXVI. Part 2, issued on 23rd August, 1948, comprises "A Description of Prosqualodon davidi Flynn, a Fossil Cetacean from Tasmania," by Professor T. Thomson Flynn, Queen's University, Belfast, "With a note on the Microscopic Tooth Structure," by J. Thornton Carter. This is the first detailed monograph of a very interesting primitive cetacean discovered by Professor Flynn in miocene beds at Wynyard, Tasmania, in September, 1919.

Part 3, comprising "The Cæcum of Primates—its Appendages, Mesenteries and Blood Supply," by W. C. Osman Hill, Department of Anatomy, University of Edinburgh, and R. E. Rewell, Zoological Society of London, was issued on 13th December, 1948. It contains a detailed account of the cæcal region of nearly all genera and most species of Primates. A large number of the specimens had been preserved and injected by Mr. W. E. Lawrence in the Zoological Society's Prosectorium. A special feature of this monograph is the six beautiful coloured plates drawn by Mrs. W. C. Osman Hill. The Society is indebted to the Royal Society and to the Carnegie Trust for the Universities of Scotland for grants towards the reproduction costs of these plates.

ZOOLOGICAL RECORD.—Bound copies of Volume 82 dealing principally with the literature of 1945, were issued on 5th May, 1948, although as usual the separate parts had all been completed and issued much earlier. All parts of Volume 83 (1946) have now been published, and the complete volume is expected to appear before Easter. The preparation of Volume 84 (1947) is also well advanced.

It is again necessary to emphasise the greatly increased cost of producing this invaluable work, partly due to the rising charges for printing and partly owing to the larger number of titles that have to be dealt with. Present donations are still inadequate to meet the cost, which is now in the neighbourhood of £3,500 for each volume. During the year the international value of this publication has been recognised by the International Union of Biological Sciences which has increased its annual grant from 500 dollars to 1,000 dollars, out of the funds allocated to it by UNESCO. Furthermore the Royal Society has doubled its annual contribution of £250 but this was not received until 1949.

Nomence Zoologicus.—A new Volume covering the literature of the years 1936-45 is now in an advanced state of preparation, and it is hoped to publish it before the end of 1949. The price will be 3½ guineas.

Zoo Life.—The third volume of this magazine was completed by the issue of Part 4, in December, 1948, which appeared in time to include a Christmas Gift order form for Volume IV. It is hoped that all Fellows of the Society will become subscribers to this, their official magazine, which they can obtain at the reduced rate of 7s. 6d. per annum, plus 1s. for postage. Order forms for Volume IV were circulated to all Fellows in the same envelope as the green admission tickets, but in case these forms may have been overlooked, a duplicate form is being enclosed with this Report.

One of the special features of the third volume was a description of the Tarsier, an interesting Primate which had never reached Europe alive until the Spring of 1948. An original painting of this animal by Maurice Wilson formed the subject of the cover of Part 3. By a curious coincidence Part 2 of the same volume contained an article on Notornis, New Zealand's Mystery Bird, which was published only a few weeks before this flightless bird, not seen for fifty years and thought to be extinct, was re-discovered. The skin of the first specimen ever recorded was brought back to England nearly a century ago, and exhibited at a meeting of the Zoological Society, in 1850.

It should be emphasised that all subscriptions to Zoo Life should be forwarded to the publishers, Messrs. Gale & Polden, Ideal House, Argyll

Street, W.1, and not to the Society's offices.

Library which it was hoped to issue during 1948, has been held up by difficulties in printing. The final proofs are now being corrected and it should therefore be available in the near future. The price of the new catalogue has been fixed at five shillings.

The number of volumes borrowed from the Library by Fellows and persons introduced by them under the regulations was 2,964, an increase

of 1,018 volumes over the preceding year.

The additions to the Library acquired by purchase, presentation, or exchange were 116 books and 3,419 parts of 532 serials. The volumes bound during the year were 699 in number, and the bindings of 119 volumes were repaired.

Gifts of books to the Library will be greatly appreciated, particularly

copies of Fellows' own works.

GIFT OF PHOTOGRAPHIC NEGATIVES.—A collection of 329 negatives of mammals, birds and reptiles, most of which were made from animals exhibited in the Gardens at Regent's Park between 1898 and 1939, were presented to the Society in July, 1948, by F. Martin Duncan, Esq., F.R.M.S., F.R.P.S.

SILHOUETTES OF SIR THOMAS AND LADY STAMFORD RAFFLES.— Framed silhouettes of Sir Thomas Stamford Raffles (Founder and first President of the Society) and Lady Raffles were presented to the Society in July, 1948, by Lady Hannon.

Drawings.—The original signed drawing by Harry Furniss of a meeting of the Society which was published in *Punch* ("Interiors and Exteriors") 1885–1886, was purchased during the year from Mr. Theodore T. Cluse.

Entrance to Regent's Park Gardens on Sunday Mornings.—The North Gate (Prince Albert Road) and the South Gate (Broad Walk, Regent's Park) are closed on Sundays until 2.30 p.m. Fellows and holders of Fellows' Tickets may obtain admission to the Gardens through the Main Gate (Outer Circle, Regent's Park) and Fellows (and friends accompanying them) may also enter through the Society's Office. The decision to close these two gates was made because the public, on seeing Fellows entering by them, were misled into thinking that the Gardens were open to them also. The resulting queues caused considerable inconvenience to Fellows who were also troubled by requests for tickets.

Visitors.—The number of visitors during 1948 was 2,335,539 at Regent's Park and 357,042 at Whipsnade Park. The corresponding figures for 1947 were 2,280,007 and 500,430 respectively. The number of visitors at Regent's Park was the second highest in the history of the Society.

AQUARIUM.—The number of visitors during 1948 was 375,590 compared with 361,352 for the year 1947.

CHILDREN'S Zoo.—The Children's Zoo was open for the summer season from 29th March until 31st October, and at week-ends during November. The number of visitors during the season was 234,047 compared with 413,960 for the 1947 season.

LEGACIES.—The following legacies were received during the year:—A final payment of £12 18s. 5d. (making a total of £357 18s. 5d.) from the late Major Arthur Corrie Keep; £100 from the late Mr. Hugh Main; £500

for Regent's Park and £300 for Whipsnade Park from the late Miss I. M. Kime.

PROSECTORIUM.—During the year 1,018 necropsies (255 on mammals, 331 on birds, and 432 on reptiles and amphibia) were performed on vertebrates dying at Regent's Park. The proportion of deaths among mammals and birds was less than during 1947. Twenty-three examinations (11 on mammals, 11 on birds, and 1 on a reptile—a Giant Tortoise), were made on animals dying at Whipsnade. The number carried out at Whipsnade was 143 (67 on mammals, 73 on birds and 3 on reptiles).

Much information has been gathered which it is hoped will be of use in the Gardens and at Whipsnade, and various papers have been published by members of the staff both on comparative anatomy and on aspects of

animal pathology which may be of interest to others.

Under the supervision of the Scientific Director research in animal pathology and comparative anatomy continues, and once again much material has been sent to other workers and to teaching departments in universities and schools. A number of scientific papers based on such material has appeared during the year.

Planning of the Gardens at Regent's Park.—A survey of all buildings and structures based on visual inspection and information obtained during building operations over the past two years has been completed. This survey is intended to show the general state of repair of all buildings, etc., and to enable future repair work to be concentrated mainly on permanent structures. The next step is the preparation of a scheme for the future development of the Gardens, and it is expected that a provisional one will be ready for consideration by the end of 1949. The general services of the Gardens are being reviewed, and the replacement of the water and gas mains is already in progress. The date when re-building can commence will depend upon the issue of permits and the provision of finance.

Collections.—Nearly 500 specimens received during 1948 were obtained as the result of collecting expeditions organised by the Society.

Mr. L. M. Flewin, Overseer of Carnivora, made a journey to India and Egypt and brought home over 200 mammals, birds and reptiles, the bulk of them being a collection sent to this Society in exchange from the Zoological Garden, Alipore, Calcutta.

In July, Mr. J. W. Lester, the Curator of Reptiles, returned from a trip to Sierre Leone bringing 16 mammals, including 5 Chimpanzees, 26 birds

and 16 reptiles.

In September, Mr. C. S. Webb, the Curator of Mammals and Birds, arrived from the British Cameroons with a collection of 60 animals. These included 8 mammals and 11 birds new to the Collection, among the latter being a specimen of the Grey-necked Picathartes, the first example of this genus ever to be exhibited.

When he arrived home from the Gold Coast to take up his appointment with the Society, Mr. G. S. Cansdale brought with him a collection of 106 mammals, birds and reptiles, including 3 young Chimpanzees and 6

species of birds new to the Collection.

Gray, Dawes and Company), Brocklebank Line and Alexander Howden, City Line Limited, Elder Dempster Lines, Elders & Fyffes Limited, General Steam Navigation Company Limited, Killick, Martin & Co., Montgomerie & Workman Limited, Union-Castle Mail Steamship Company Limited, the United Africa Company, United States Lines, the British Overseas Airways Corporation, Pan American Airways, the Royal Dutch Air Lines. As usual Mr. A. G. Beach, F.Z.S., of Messrs. Gray, Dawes & Company, and Mr. R. Lennox, F.Z.S., of the Ministry of Transport, have rendered invaluable services in connection with the transport of collectors and animals.

In addition, the Society is much indebted to the Earl of Leicester, G.C.V.O., and to Mrs. Powell-Cotton for their continued kindness in providing evergreen oak for the Okapi and Giraffes, to Mr. T. P. Vandeleur, F.Z.S., who has sent regular supplies of bamboo shoots for the Giant Panda.

FINANCE.

INCOME AND EXPENDITURE.

(a) REGENT'S PARK. The income was £249,488 (an increase of £942) and the expenditure amounted to £238,666 (an increase of £20,682).

(b) Whipsnade Park. The income was £48,165 (a decrease of £8,699), and the expenditure amounted to £54,461 (a decrease of £10,585).

(c) Surplus. The net surplus (after making appropriations to Funds to meet future liabilities) carried to the General Purposes Account, amounted to £4,348, as compared with a surplus of £22,205 for 1947.

ASSETS, LIABILITIES AND BALANCE.

(a) Assets. At the end of the year the total assets of the Society amounted to £813,176, an increase of £53,496 on the corresponding figure for 1947.

(b) LIABILITIES. The liabilities amounted to £154,541, an increase of

£41,625 on the corresponding figure for 1947.

(c) Balance. The balance, a surplus of assets over liabilities, amounted to £658,635, an increase of £11,871 on the corresponding figure for 1947.
